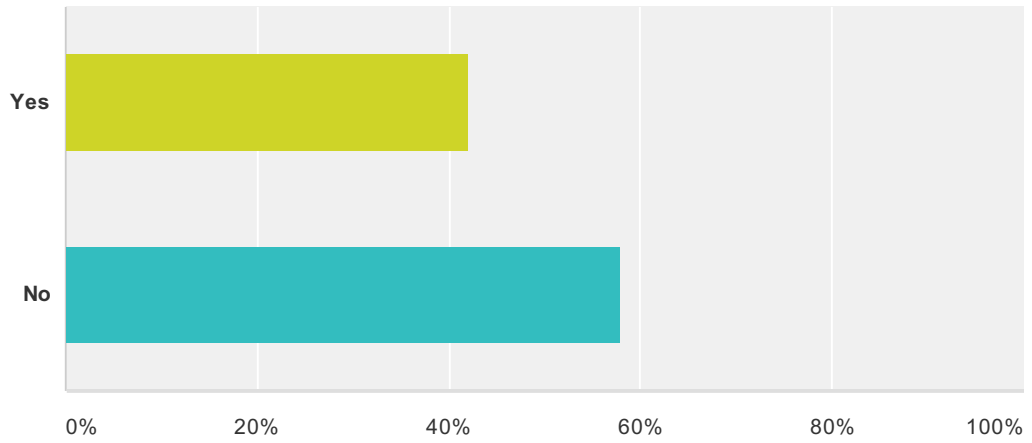


### Q1 Do you submit resolutions to the CAPG Resolutions Committee?

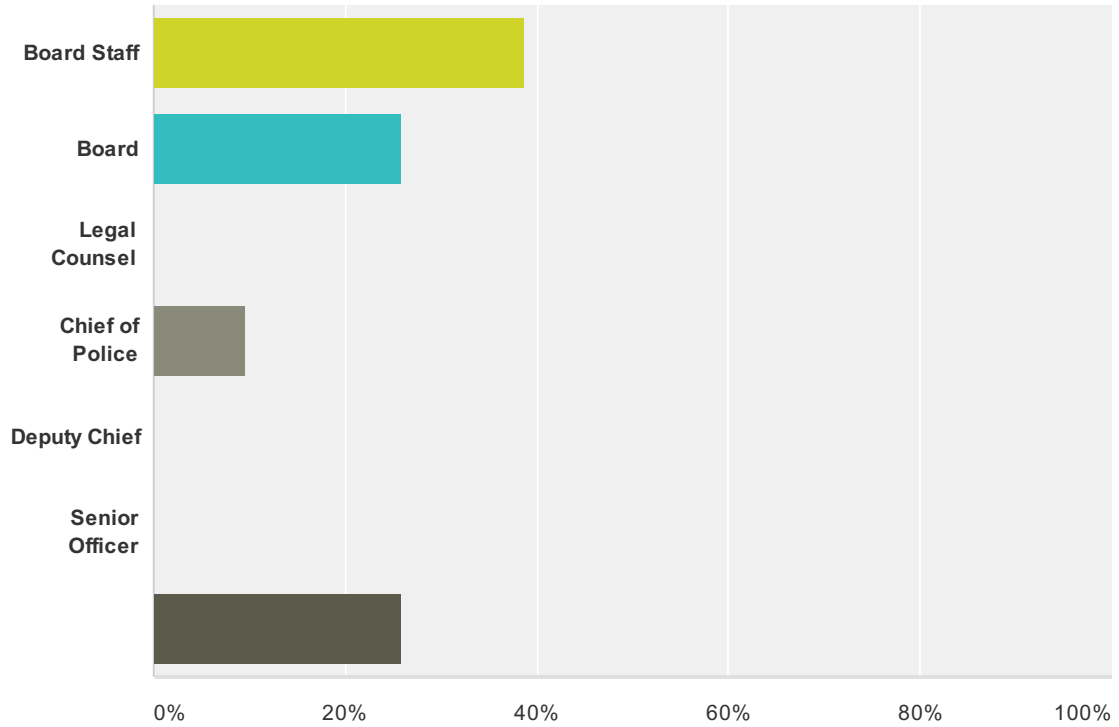

## Q2 If you answered yes to the question above, who drafts your resolutions?

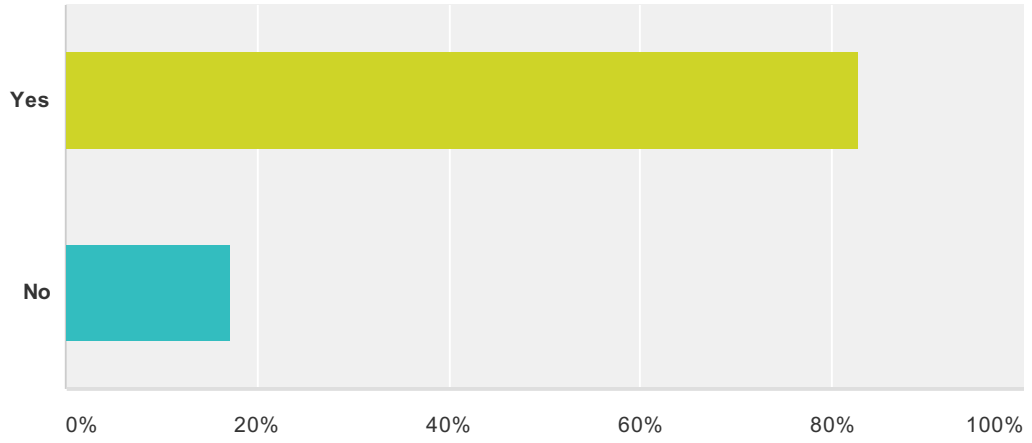

### Q3 Do you believe resolutions are important for CAPG?

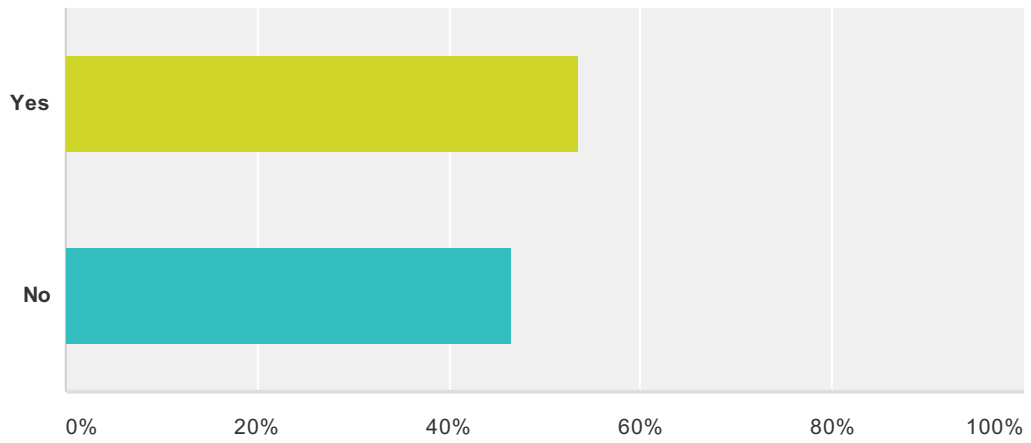

### Q4 Should there be a limit on how many resolutions are approved at the Annual General Meeting (AGM)?

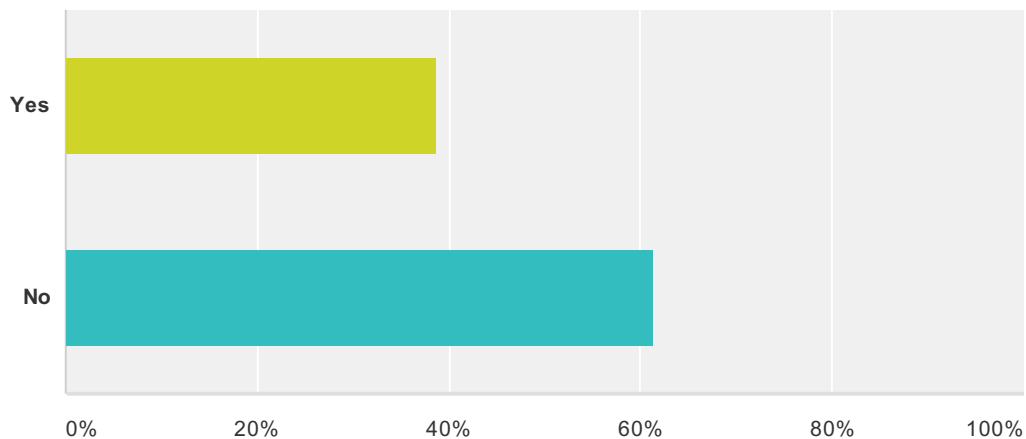

### Q5 Do you get input from your community on the issues they wish to see moved forward to Ottawa?

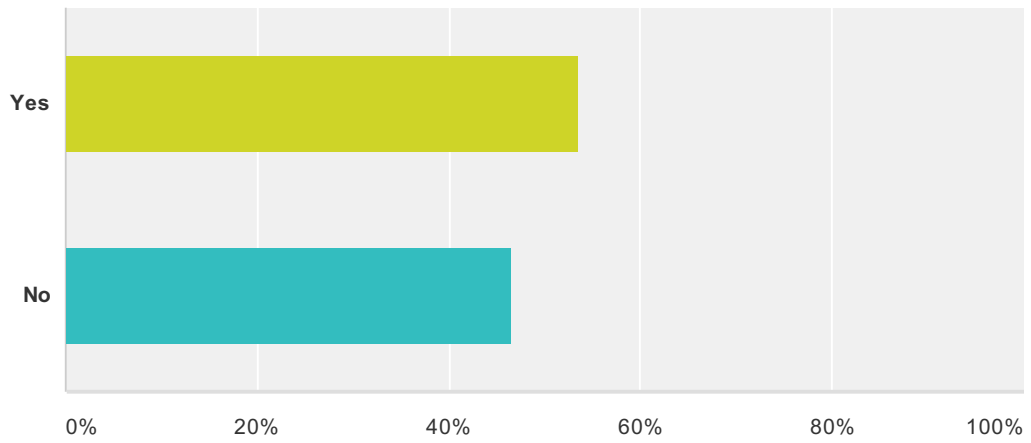

### Q6 Should CAPG continue with the resolutions process as it currently operates?

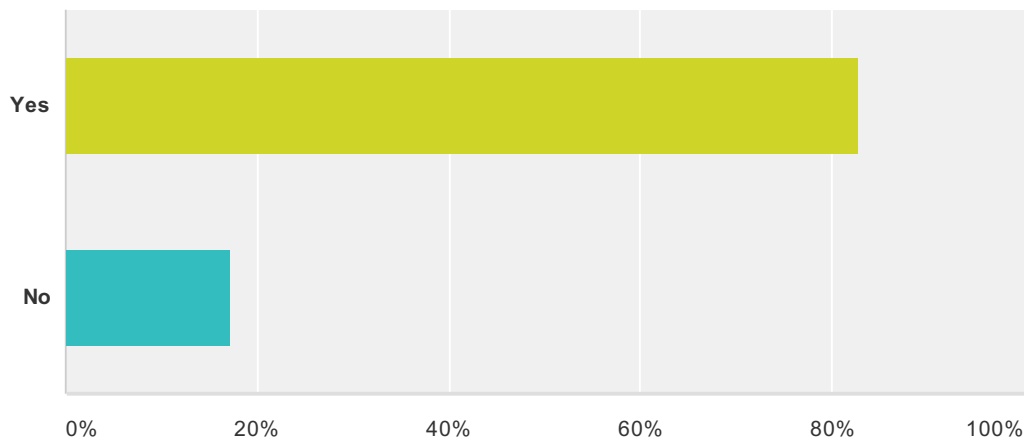
